As you explore plans with your children for the summer of 2017, we hope you will consider the many offerings we have here at the University of Wisconsin – Marathon County for discovery, imagination and fun while learning!

All of our classes are taught by highly trained and talented instructors from the university and area school districts. Our programs are for children seeking fun and adventurous learning opportunities. These engaging classes are designed to stimulate curiosity, encourage creativity, instill confidence, and develop problem-solving and critical thinking skills—while having a great time!

NEW THIS SUMMER: We have new exciting programs to add to the summer mix! During the same time as College for Kids, students who are 8 – 14 years old can participate in Camp Imagination which focuses on the importance of STEAM (Science Technology Engineering Art and Math). Students can make their own mobile apps, design their own Minecraft® characters and bring them to life, learn, design and edit CODE and make their own first 3D video game. This is our second year for Girl Power Camp: Rock and Roll Edition. This program is a full-day, week-long experience for girls between the ages of 8 and 13. Write, Compose, Choreograph, and Film your own “Girl Power” Music Video! Girls will learn from experts about writing song lyrics, the finer points of music video making, costume and set design. In July, the Wizarding Academy returns for its 10th year! Harry Potter fans will gather again for a fun, interactive adventure.
